

Supplemental Educational Services in Mapleton Public Schools 2010-2011

Supplemental Educational Services are free after school tutoring services that are available to students at Monterey Community School in grades K-6. First priority is given to students who are eligible for free/reduced meals. Parents choose an appropriate provider from the list that has been approved by CDE. Once a parent has selected a provider, they will contact Susie Daniels at 303.853.1020. Mapleton Public Schools will meet with the provider and the parent to contract tutoring services with that provider.

Number of students served in Supplemental Educational Services in Mapleton Public Schools:

2009-2010: 75 students served; 165 eligible students attended Enrichment Academy

2008-2009: SES was not required by NCLB; 0 students were served by SES funds.

2007-2008: SES was not required by NCLB; 0 students were served by SES funds.

School Choice 2010-11

Families of students at Global Leadership Academy, Monterey Community School and Meadow Community School received letters informing them of their school's AYP status and identification of needing improvement in reading and/or math. All families of students in Mapleton Public Schools have the choice of what school they would like to attend and transportation is provided. However, under NCLB law, Mapleton is required to inform families about schools that have not been identified as needing improvement by letter prior to the start of school. These letters are posted on the Mapleton website and provide a list of the schools that have not been identified as needing improvement.

Number of eligible students who participated in school choice in Mapleton Public Schools:

2009-2010: 768 eligible students attended Enrichment, Adventure, and Monterey. A total of 14 students transferred to another school.

2008-2009: 528 eligible students attended Enrichment and Monterey. A total of 24 students transferred to another school.

2007-2008: 0 eligible students
